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Season #3 of the Perth Motorplex was set to begin with a Sportsman show on the 1st of November 2002, but rain put paid to that, seeing the Grand Opening being a week later on the 9th of November.

Seven divisions would be programmed on the opening night, Todd Waddell claiming the Junior Sedans feature, Gavin Migro the privateers (360) main event and Slovenian Matej Ferjan the Solo's feature. John Purser claimed victory in the Modified Sedans, Dene McAllan the Speedcars, Brad Blake the Late Models and Ryan Farrell the Sprintcars main event.

World Series Sprintcars would hit town a couple of weeks later with Australian Champion Max Dumesny claiming the 30-lap feature over Queenslanders Cameron Gessner and Stephen Bell. Dene McAllan won the Speedcars on the same night, Craig Vosbergen the Late Models and future Sprintcar star Carl Dowling was victorious in the Junior Sedans.

A sportsman show on the 6th of December 2002 saw Warren Oldfield claim his second Street Stock main event with Northern Territorian visitor Mark Brown claiming the AMCA Nationals feature.



Dene McAllan (above) would claim his third Speedcar main event in a row on the 14th of December, while Brad Blake would start a four-race winning streak in the Late Models on this same night.

Boxing Night would see the Americans in town, Greg Wilson and Jason Johnson filling out the top two positions in the twenty-five-lap feature event ahead of Jamie Maiolo after Ryan Farrell crossed the line in first position but was later disqualified on a program that featured eight divisions racing.

The New Year saw Jason Johnson (right) go one better to claim the next main event, defeating Jeff Leisk and Michael Figliomeni. The legendary Johnny Andersson claimed the Formula 500 feature while Neville Lance (Speedcars), Ben Ellement (Modified Sedans), Todd Waddell (Junior Sedans), Dave Cheshire (Solo's), and Brad Blake (Late Models) all won features.

The 1st of February would see
Michael Figliomeni return to the
winner's circle in the Sprintcars, with
Joe Little on top in the Speedcars and
Dave Plecas in the Modified Sedans
claiming the win, with another five
divisions also on the program.

Mid-February would see the
Australian Late Model Title held for
the second year in a row, once again
decided over three feature races,
Ryan Halliday won the first two
ahead of Brad Blake and Brad Ludlow
while the final one went to Blake over
Halliday and Bruce Trenaman,
Halliday getting the nod overall.

On the same program Ryan Farrell, Trevor Harding Sr., Neville Lance, Travis Jackson, Sean Zemunik and Scott Spark all won features.

The 8th of March saw the annual King of Wings event help, with American Paul McMahon returning in the Monte Motorsports #6 machine to claim victory from the visiting Robbie Farr and Luch Monte. Ken Sartori took victory in the privateers feature event on this night, while Matt Brown would claim his first ever Motorplex feature event on this night in the Formula 500's.

Rain would end the next Super Speedway night, with three feature races held (going to Wayne Armstrong, Wayne Dymock and Allan Smallwood) before being washed out.

The rain would continue and wash out the originally scheduled 12th of April Grand Finale, seeing it



to the 26th of April. This event would also feature the WA Sprintcar Title, won by Jeff Leisk (pictured below) from Pino Priolo and Mark Wells, while Ivor Ladwig (Late Models), Jamie Oldfield (Speedcars), Travis Jackson (Modified Sedans), Carl Dowling (Junior Sedans, above) and Wayne Dymock (Formula 500's) all finished their seasons on a high.



Brad Blake would top the feature race charts for this season, claiming seven main event wins while Neville Lance and Wayne Dymock were next best having claimed four wins apiece in Speedcars and Formula 500's respectively. Four other drivers claimed three wins, ten drivers won two, and twenty-seven drivers claimed one win each, sharing in 74 feature wins.

The final night of the season would also be a special occasion, with Con Migro, long-time Promoter/Managing Director of Claremont Speedway and then of the Motorplex in its early years, officially stepping down. Con would continue his commentary, but son Gavin would take over the Speedway

Season #3 2002/03

Welcome to the third round of the Maddington Toyota Sprintcar Series for the 2024-25 Championship.

While it is only the third outing in the season-long battle, it is much more than that

It is the next chapter in the timehonoured event that is now known as the Scardifields Smash Repairs King of Wings.

Over the years the event has been won by some of the biggest names in the sport, with interstate and overseas drivers throwing their hat into the ring to try and claim the event.

This year the international interest is taken up by New Zealand throttle stomper Michael Pickens.

He is back for his second appearance in the Sean Carrenowned Goldstar Transport W95.

Pickens contested the first round of the series in this car a few weeks back - and despite only just getting to the track in time from the airport and also racing a Speedcar on the night, he put on a show.

That started by setting the Victory 1 Performance Quick Time at the start of the event in a brand-new track record time. He is now officially the fastest person ever around the Perth Motorplex.

From there he progressed from P4 to third in his heat race and was second in the B Dash behind Queenslander Ryan Newton.

This put Pickens out of P4 in the 30lap final on a very fast racetrack, where ultimately, he finished second to Newton.

Pickens, who is a seasoned professional, will be much better for

> that experience and many punters will be following his progress in this

weekend's round.

The King of Wings format is a little different - instead of the usual 30 lap feature race, it is extended to 40 laps, with a twist.

A compulsory mid-race pitstop will be called where all teams will head to the infield work area and have a short period of time to make the necessary changes to their cars.

It becomes a game of strategy.

Do you keep the set-up the same for the second half of the journey, or do you throw the kitchen sink at it and try something different?

Well that all depends on where you are positioned on the track when the midrace caution is called.

The game of strategy will see drivers working with their crews to find the ultimate balance for the car and hopefully see them cross the line in P1 at the end of the 40-lap battle.

Dayne Kingshott won this race last year, and given he also won the Westernapolis event here two weeks ago, he will be one to watch.

Kingshott is settling into a nice groove in the Krikke Motorsport W2.

At the last show he was third in his qualifying group, giving him a front row start for his heat race, which he went on to win.

Kingshott then won his Dash to start from pole for the main event which he led from start to finish in a race then went 30-laps non-stop.

This was on the back of the season opener where he started P6 and finished fifth.

As a result, Kingshott is the early series points leader, on 440 points, six points better than Kaiden Manders on 434.

Manders has had a good start to the season, banking a pair of fourths in the first two feature races.

He started the season in strong form after contesting races in a few States and Territories in the WA off-season.

Callum Williamson is third overall on 430 points.

The former two-time series champion was seventh in the season



opener before taking a third at the last

Kris Coyle, who was eighth in the first event of the season, banked some solid points in round two with a fifth after a great battle with Manders and Williamson.

Brad Maiolo, who was the first WA driver home in the first round, behind Queensland's Newton and NZ's Pickens, is fifth overall in the points so

At the Westernapolis he struggled a bit, starting 11th and finishing 12th.

Older brother Jamie is next on points after an 11th in round one and a sixth in round two.

Taylor Milling has finished ninth in both feature races and as a result is seventh so far in points, ahead of Jason Kendrick who has been 10th on both occasions, Ryan Lancaster, who was eighth at the last show and Jack Williamson, who rounds out the top 10 with a 12th and 13th so far.

Young Williamson has shown plenty of pace early on, qualifying for the A Dash on both occasions and starting up the order.

In late news, we would also like to welcome back Queensland based throttle stomper Ryan Newton who contested the opening two rounds. A win and a second place impressed many, including the Monte Motorsports team.

They have contacted Newton, who contested the opening rounds in his own machinery, to drive the revered WA#17 for tonight's show as they celebrate 25 years of the team.

Another element of spice to an already massive show!

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

The very first Sprintcar "King of the Wings" was staged during the 1981-82 Wings" attracted a classy field to the season (Friday, March 19, 1982) at the Claremont Speedway.

The 25-lap event saw the current WA titleholder "Lethal" Lee Foster rule supreme over Noel Bradford, Bill Sutherland and Des Nash.

The 1982-83 classic over 20-laps went to Bill Sutherland from Noel Bradford, Ron Krikke and Lee Foster.

For the 1983-84 event, the race distance was reduced to 15-laps – the shortest ever - and it resulted in a repeat victory for Bill Sutherland over Des Nash, Ron Krikke and Noel Bradford.

A longer 30-lap event was programmed during the 1984-85 season when Lee Foster downed Eric Shier, Bob Kinnear and Alf Barbagallo.

It was Lee Foster again in the 25-lap 1985-86 event over Ron Krikke, Noel Bradford and John Krikke.

The event was not held in the summer of 1986-87 but re-appeared the next season with sponsorship from Coca Cola – a situation that continued for many years.

So, the first winner to sip a coke in "Victory Lane" was Allan McCarthy, after he had dispatched Steven Arrigo, lan Bradford and Dave Thomson.

During the 1988-89 season the scheduled February 24 date was washed out and the race was tacked onto the end of the original season of April 7.

Winner of the 20-lap classic was Sharon Marriott - causing the term "Queen of the Scene" to be used instead of the customary "King of the Wings". Following Sharon across the line were John Krikke, Ian Bradford and Ron Krikke.

In 1989-90 it was the Geraldton youngster Mark Wells who led home Shane Murphy, Ron Krikke and Lee Foster.

A year later (1990-91) Shane Murphy added his name to the "Honour Board" when he scored the win over Ron Krikke, Allan McCarthy and Sharon Marriott.

The tenth running of the "King of the Claremont bowl and it was the legendary Sydneysider Garry Rush who triumphed in the 1991-92 event over Mark Wells, Max Dumesny (NSW) and Jeff Leisk.

The 1992-93 event saw Mark Wells head Garry Rush, the current Australian titleholder Ron Krikke and Jeff Leisk.

Ten-times Australian Sprintcar Champion Garry Rush lowered the 20-lap record to 5:07.67 when he beat Mark Wells, Ron Krikke and Eddy Gobby in the 1993-94 event.

Another Sydneysider Brooke Tatnell was successful in 1994-95 as he knocked the 25-lap record down to 6:19.07 when he scored over Shane Krikke, Ryan Farrell and John Krikke.

Another washout occurred during the summer of 1995-96 – the original Friday March 22 date replaced by a Monday night show on March 25. This time it was the great Garry Rush who triumphed joining Lee Foster as a three-times victor of the annual west coast classic.

Following "King Garry" home were Gavin Migro, Ron Krikke and Daryl Krikke.

The 1996-97 event was a very emotional affair, being held a week after the tragic deaths of Daryl and Jason Krikke in a car accident on their home to Bunbury after the Speedway. Shane Murphy took out the event from American Kenny Jacobs and Gavin Migro.

In 1997-98 the weather intervened again, with the race being moved from Friday March 20 to Monday March 23. And the winner was Ron Krikke – driving the #95 Maxim "For the Boys" - as he downed American Randy Hannagan, Trevor Green (SA) and Ryan Farrell.

In 1998-99 Randy Hannagan triumphed over Pino Priolo, Ryan Farrell and Ron Krikke

As part of the "End of an Era" season at the historic Claremont Speedway (1999-2000) we saw the talented youngster Jamie Maiolo prove too strong for Ryan Farrell, Pino Priolo and Grant Bevan.

At the first running of the "King of the Wings' here at the Perth Motorplex (2000-01) it was Robbie Farr (NSW) piloting the Monte Motorsport #15 entry who finished in front of Michael Figliomeni, current Australian titleholder Skip Jackson and Max Dumesny.

A year later we saw Michael Figliomeni in command over Aussie champ Max Dumesny, Ken Sartori and Gavin Migro.

There were some very emotional scenes in "victory lane" for the 2002-03 event as American star Paul McMahan triumphed over Robbie Farr and Luch Monte.

McMahan was piloting a Monte Motorsport entry in the race which remembered the late Michael Nanovich, a former sponsor and great mate of the Monte Motorsport

In 2003-04 we saw the current Australian Champ Robbie Farr pilot the Shane Krikke Motorsport entry to victory over Jamie Maiolo, Luch Monte and Jeff Leisk.

A year later Farr repeated the victory when he drove the Titan Garages entry into "victory lane" ahead of Max Dumesny and Phil March.

The 2005-06 edition of the prestige event saw the likeable American Dean Jacobs take the honours ahead of Ken Sartori, Farr (back in the Krikke entry) and Cameron Gessner

The following summer it was Sydney star Kerry Madsen aboard the Jeff Leisk owned car who triumphed over American Shane Stewart, Ryan Farrell and Farr.

The 2007-08 version saw Robbie Farr snared his fourth victory in the annual west coast classic when he led home Luch Monte, Kerry Madsen and Ryan Farrell.

The popular "Geraldton Jet" Mark Wells took his third victory in the annual classic during the 2008-09 season over Ryan Farrell, American Tim Shaffer and Robbie

In the 2009-10 event we saw Brooke Tatnell down Kerry Madsen, Jason Johnson (USA) and Steven Lines.

Jamie Maiolo then led home Kerry Madsen, Ben Ellement and Ken Sartori in the 2010-

The "King" in the 2011-12 shootout was Ken Sartori, piloting the #41 Cowara Motorsport car that was later driven by Cameron Gessner. Rookie driver Lee Nash finished second ahead of David Priolo and Jason Kendrick.

In the 2012-13 event we saw Ryan Farrell triumph over Jamie Maiolo, Ben Ellement, Wells and Lee Nash.

Formula

For twenty-four years the flying Formula 500's have been racing on the high banks of the Perth Motorplex as part of the annual King of Kwinana event, and this season will be no different.

Twenty-one Limited Sprintcars head here to the banks of the Perth Motorplex tonight to chase the glory of being crowned King of Wings.

The field is full of drivers wanting to take the crown and if recent history in this race is anything to go by Michael Keen will again be the one to chase, having won the event on the last four occasions - chasing down early race leader Jarrin Bielby two years ago to win from Bielby and Daniel Keen while last season he took over the lead from early front runner Chad Pittard to take the win with Pittard second and Joel Ettridge third.

Tonight will see Keen doing double duty: the majority of his season spent in the Sprintcar division, but tonight he returns to his roots and will campaign his regular #95 Limited Sprintcar as well in his quest to make it five in a row.

Tonight's race also doubles as the Merv Woolford Memorial once again, having been introduced as part of the race back in season 2018/19.

over Shaun Bradford and Brad Maiolo.


The following season saw Jamie Maiolo score a narrow victory over Jason Kendrick and Andrew Priolo.



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


