WELCOME TO THE 25TH ANNIVERSARY SEASON AT THE PERTH MOTORPLEX, KWINANA BEACH!

Good evening race fans and welcome back to what is set to be a huge two nights of racing!

We have absolutely packed the program full of non-stop action over the next two nights, so as the saying goes, 'if this doesn't turn you on, you haven't got a switch!'

The 28th annual Krikke Boys Shootout will be held across two nights and with another star studded field including no less than twelve visiting drivers, whoever is able to claim the win will certainly have earned it.

Former champions James McFadden (three times), Kerry Madsen

(two times), Kris Coyle, Lachlan McHugh and Jock Goodyer (once each) are all in the field, Goodyer as the defending champion in particular keen to continue his love affair with the West Coast and take some more of our money back to Tasmania, though Wednesday night winner Madsen certainly looked the goods and should be one to watch again! We also welcome former Australian Champion Skip Jackson here this weekend, the now Knoxville, Iowa domiciled superstar serving as Grand Marshall! Welcome back Skip.

Also across the two nights we will see the 66th annual Opal Finance WA Formula 500 Title contested and with another great field of the pocket rockets, it will be interesting to see who walks away with the coveted #1. The action this season from the division has been great and although on paper Cody Turacchio has claimed the bulk of the wins, there has been plenty of pressure from names like Marshman, Sinagra, Andersson, Newmarch and Brown while defending champion Steven Ellement certainly isn't going to let his Title get away without a fight!

Friday night will see the LS1 Sprintcars get another chance under the bright lights of the Motorplex, the second time in as many weeks, while on Saturday the Limited Sprintcars will join the fray. The KBS event is one that the Limo's hold dear and we can be certain that not one driver will be holding back in their quest for glory!

Rounding out the program on Saturday will be the 28th annual Western Australian Late Model Title and with a record field nominated this will be an absolute lung buster. This event is the perfect lead in for the upcoming March madness shows which include the Mobil 1 Australian Late Model Championships, the Michael Holmes Racing Hump Day Hustle and the Late Model Nationals: five nights of racing in nine days! Australian Champion Joe Chalmers has been in red hot form but those Oldfield brothers Jamie, Warren and Jason have also been right there. You can never discount the veteran Brad Blake, while in the wings there is a stack of drivers waiting for their shot at glory so you can bet that this one will be a throw down battle!

Once again, a huge thankyou to the team that works to put on all these shows. Five nights of racing in nine nights is no easy feat: for our track prep team, for our production team, for our ticketing team, for our officials, for our venue employees: the work is non-stop preparation for each night with a short turnaround, so to each of them, I say thankyou. Thankyou also to you the fans, because without you, we wouldn't have a show. Thankyou for consistently showing up, thankyou for tuning in and supporting our live coverage and thankyou for sharing your love for our sport at every opportunity, in particular in a positive way on social media. The power of the people is finally starting to see our sport become more recognised and I for one, could not be any more excited about it!

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Season #15 would kick off on exactly the same date as the previous one: 11th October. It would again be a FAST Racing Series show, with ten divisions on show to welcome in the new season.

The official Super Speedway opener was a week later and for the second year in a row Andrew Priolo would win the Grand Opening Showdown for the Formula 500's while Lee Redmond claimed the Speedcars feature, Warren Oldfield the Late Models, Steven Rice claimed his one and only Perth Motorplex feature win in the Wingless Sprints and Ryan Farrell was back on the winners dais in the Sprintcars.



A couple of weeks later it was the annual Magic Man 34 event with Kaiden Manders (above) claiming his first ever feature race win in the Speedcars 34 lap main event. Aboard the McAllan Motorsport #21, Kaiden would defeat Lee Redmond and Dayne Kingshott and set off a ten year winning streak here at the Motorplex. The only other feature event on the night was the Sprintcars with Shaun Bradford defeating Ryan Farrell and Trent Pigdon after the Late Models feature was postponed to be run at a later date.

Six days later would be another FAST show before a bit of a break until the King of Wings on the 22nd of November. Cameron Gessner would claim the 40-lap feature from David Priolo and Brooke Tatnell, while Merv Woolford (Limited Sprintcars), Scott Glazebrook (Speedcars), Steven Ellement (Formula 500's) and Jake Beard-Miller (360 Sprintcars) were also claimed Kings of Kwinana.

The WA Sprintcar Title was next on the list, with Jason Kendrick claiming his second WA Title ahead of American Kyle Hirst and Brooke Tatnell, while Troy Johnson raced to victory in the Formula 500's.

The Late Models would contest two feature races on this night: Craig Vosbergen winning the rescheduled Magic Man feature (Podium pic below) while Warren Oldfield raced to victory in the other.



Ten divisions raced in the FAST show a fortnight later, while the Boxing Day Bonanza was next on the program, names like Chris Dymock (Formula 500), Kaiden Manders (Speedcars), Ryan Farrell (Sprintcars), Ryan Halliday (Late Models) and Dustin Higgs (Super Sedans) all claiming wins.

The Sprintcar Muster would ring in the New Year, with five divisions on the card. Ryan Farrell claimed another feature win in the Sprintcar while Jake Beard Miller (360), Brayden Miller (Limited), Troy Johnson (Formula's) and Matthew Iwanow (Wingless) who claimed his first ever Motorplex feature race win.

Jamie Maiolo returned to the top step when he won the Sprintcar feature at the January 24 show, with Jake Beard Miller, (360), Dayne Kingshott (Speedcars), Gary Higgs (Super Sedans) and Troy Johnson (Formula 500's) also recording wins.

Similar to last season, World Series was next on the card, first with a round on the 7th of February won by Australian Champion David Murcott (Mark House also won the Formula 500 feature and Tom Payet the Wingless), then with the Grand Finale on the 21st of February. This was won by Kerry Madsen over Ryan Farrell and Brooke Tatnell while Adrian Haywood won the Formula 500's.



The Westernapolis event returned to event programming after a significant break at the next show, three weeks later, which also featured the WA Speedcar Title. Dayne Kingshott (above) won another WA Speedcar Sprintcars feature, with Glenn Carstairs in the Formula 500's and Gary Higgs in the Super Sedans also racing their way to victory.

A rescheduled FAST show was next on the 27th of March (after the 13th of March was washed out), while the John Day Firecracker was held the very next night. Craig Vosbergen won the Late Models, Dayne Kingshott the Speedcars, Matt Vincent the Wingless Sprints and Ryan Farrell the Sprintcars.

The season began to draw to a close in April; the traditional Silver Cup held on the 4th of April with Matthew Iwanow, Dayne Kingshott, Ryan Farrell, Jake Beard Miller and Ben Migro all claiming wins in Wingless, Speedcars, Sprintcars, 360 Sprintcars and Limited Sprintcars respectively while a fortnight later the Gold Cup Grand Finale was held, with Travis Armstrong (Junior Sedans), Tom Hooper (Formula 500's), Dayne Kingshott (Speedcars), Jamie Oldfield (Late Models) and Victorian Jamie Veal (Sprintcars) all recording wins.

To round out the season two more FAST shows were held, the 26th of April seeing six divisions features while the 9th of May had ten.

One hundred and four feature races were decided across the season, sixty five drivers sharing the wins with Jake Beard-Miller walking away with the most, having scored six victories. Next best was Dayne Kingshott and Ryan Farrell each with five while Brayden Miller scored four. Four drivers had three wins, fifteen drivers had two and forty two drivers with one apiece.



At the end of season awards night, Ryan Farrell (above) was announced at the prestigious Perth Motorplex Driver of the Year for a record third time. Welcome back to the Perth Motorplex.

But the big question is – have you actually left?

This Friday and Saturday nights marks the fourth and fifth nights of the Festival of Sprintcars that all kicked off last Friday night.

Congratulations to Tasmanian Jock Goodyer for winning the Barbagallo Australian Mr Sprintcar Nationals here last Saturday night, banking a rather handy \$40,077.

Teams had a few days off before returning for the Midweek Mayhem show on Wednesday night.

On this occasion, victory went to Kerry Madsen from Lachlan McHugh and Kaiden Manders.

It might have been a midweek show, but there was plenty of action – and as is usually the case with Sprintcars – a dose of drama was added to the mix.

The first lap of the feature race saw an incident in pits bend involving Luke Oldfield, Goodyer and youngster Harrison Peet, with a couple of other cars taking evasive action.

A few laps later Daniel Harding was out of the show after contact with Michael Pickens saw the W18 slide infield with front-end damage – another cruel end for Harding who is showing a lot of pace in the Trevor Jolly-owned car.

When it came to the rest of the race, McHugh was the early leader over Ryan Newton and Madsen and he was leading as the front runners hit the lapped traffic with just six laps in the books.

There was a caution with 12 laps to go after Myles Bolger had a spin – fortunately for Bolger there was no damage this time after he hit the fence hard last Friday night, heavily damaging the W13.

On the restart McHugh led away from Madsen and Newton, and Australian champion James McFadden, who started from p24, by this stage was up to seventh.

Madsen and McHugh traded blows on the restart and it was Madsen who won the battle and set sail for home.

Newton, who was running third at that stage, was out of the contest with a handful of laps remaining.

McFadden finished fourth, ahead of Cory Eliason, with Marcus Dumesny, Goodyer, Pickens, Brad Maiolo and Michael Keen who rounded out the top 10.

Manders was the quickest in qualifying, setting the Victory 1 Performance Quick Time with a best lap of 12.819 seconds – with the result coming from the first qualifying group.

Eliason was quickest in the second qualifying group with a best lap of 12.887, while Pickens was quickest in the third qualifying session with a 12.962.

Taylor Milling failed to get a qualifying lap with a damaged differential.

Manders won the first heat race from Keen and Oldfield – in what proved to be a damaging race for some, including McFadden.

Contact between Oldfield and McFadden put the A1 on the infield and he missed the next round of racing.

After the incident Oldfield was apologetic for the contact.

The second heat to McHugh over Chircop and Eliason, while Madsen won the third and final heat race from Newton and Goodyer.

Madsen earnt his front row start after winning the A Dash from Manders and Pickens, while McHugh won the B Dash, to also start on the front row, winning that bout from McHugh and Newton.

Coyle won the Midpack Dash from Jason Kendrick and Brad Maiolo.

A big thank you must go to all the interstate drivers who have made the effort to come back to WA for more racing.



It takes a huge commitment and financial outlay to travel long distances to go racing here.

For Newton, this is the third time his truck has come across the Nullarbor since we started back in late October.

Jake Smith, Dylan Menz, Mick Saller, Marcus Dumesny and Jock Goodyer have all sent their own gear over as well, which a massive effort and one we here in WA all appreciate.

This weekend is the last time we will see American Cory Eliason in action for the Monte Motorsport crew before he heads back to the US.

The same goes for Madsen who has had a strong second half of the season in the Diamond Bay Motorsport entry.

To say the racing in the 2024-25 Maddington Toyota Sprintcar Series has been sensational is a massive understatement.

The good news is – we haven't finished yet.


This weekend all teams will be chasing glory in the time-honoured Krikke Boys Shootout – something they all desperately want to win.

With this year marking the sixty-sixth running of the WA Formula 500 Title, it is the perfect time to have a look back over the history books as we all begin to speculate on who may be next to add their name to the winners list.

This is the sixth time that the Kwinana venue has hosted the WA Formula 500 Championship, the fourth time as a stand alone event as the first two times it formed part of a series to determine the champion, and the first time in the last three years it has been there. Last time it was Steven Ellement defeating American visitor Jake Hagopian and Matt brown, while previously Thomas Davies (15/16) and Ellement (08/09) won the other stand alone shows.

Starting in the 1957/58 season, the division was then known as TQ's and the event (and the following two title events) were won by Wally Higgs.

In the 1973/74 season the title underwent a name change to Formula 500's, with the event being won by Bill Richards, a man who had one of the longest racing careers across any division in speedway. Bill also finished second on three occasions, giving him four total podium finishes in the title event over the years and he has been honoured a number of times since then, with the preliminary night event having been named after him a number of times.

The event history of the WA Formula 500 is a virtual who's who of Formula 500/TQ legends, with winner's right across its history performing well in multiple titles as well as on the national stage.

Leading the stats is none other than Johnny Andersson, a six time champion who featured on the podium another eight times, with three seconds and five thirds. This means that from the 1964/65 season through to his last podium in the 1994/95 season, a period of thirty one years, Andersson featured on the podium a total of fourteen times and making him the most successful driver in the history of the event.

Amazingly, Steven Ellement has now equaled Johnny's famous six wins, and has four seconds, one more than JA, but overall has three less podiums as JA has five third places as opposed to Ellement's one, though Ellement has a big chance to take over the leaderboard if he claims a win this weekend. He has featured on the podium six out of the last seven times the title was completed, and eight out of the last ten, a stat he would love to add to this weekend. There are only two other drivers to feature on the podium in double digits, in Phil Crofts and Matt Brown! Crofts put in a series of spectacular performances to finish on the podium eleven times, including two wins, from the 1990/91 season through to 2006/07. That's an amazing eleven podiums in seventeen seasons! Brown on the other hand has been working his way through the ranks and now has a total of ten podium finishes including four wins, three seconds and three thirds, all over twenty two seasons.

Despite having less total podium finishes with eight, Bill Broadwood is still ahead of Crofts on wins after becoming a four-time champion. Featuring on the podium a total of eight times across sixteen years is certainly an impressive effort.

Bryan Mullings, Noel Potts and Wally Higgs, have all claimed three title wins while interestingly, Higgs and Potts remain the only two drivers to have ever won the title event in three consecutive years, both in the first six years of the event being held! Ellement of course has that opportunity ahead of him this weekend also!

Eight drivers have also claimed two wins in the Title event, the most recent of those being defending champion Glenn Carstairs after his victory a few seasons ago at Narrogin, while a further twenty drivers have claimed victory on one occasion.

Eighty-one drivers have claimed a podium finish in the sixtyfive-year history of the event thus far, the last of whom was American Jake Hagopian who claimed his first last time the event was held at the Motorplex with both of last year's podium getters Chris Dymock and Matt Brown having featured on the podium before, while a total of thirty five drivers have claimed a win.

Brad Chapman would have to be the most successful in WA titles to have never actually have claimed a win, with a total of four podium finishes including two seconds and two thirds. Ken Neilson and Chris Dymock have also grabbed a second and two thirds without a victory.

So who will take the Title?

The Formula 500's of WA and the Perth Motorplex are gearing up for another action-packed weekend as the best of the best in Formula 500 racing battle it out for glory in the 2025 WA Formula 500 Title!

This prestigious event will unfold over two thrilling nights, with a stellar lineup of eighteen competitors nominated, featuring an elite group of past champions who collectively boast an astonishing fourteen WA Title wins.

Leading the charge is six-time and defending champion Steven Ellement, determined to add yet another title to his incredible record. Hot on his heels will be four-time champion Matt Brown, two-time champion Glenn Carstairs, 2011/12 champion David Sinagra, and 2015/16 titleholder Thomas Davies, all eager to reclaim the top step of the podium.

Adding to the excitement, previous podium finishers Chris Dymock (with one second-place and two third-place finishes) and Cody Turacchio (with a second and a third) are also set to throw their hats in the ring.

But they won't have it easy—plenty of other high-speed contenders are ready to shake up the standings, including Chloe Newmarch, Rhys Cumming, and Flynn Roser, each hungry for their shot at WA Title glory.







WA Formula 500 Title History



Matt Brown Formula 500's

Much like Jamie Maiolo at #12, Matt Brown is one of only a few remaining competitors who began making a name for themselves in the era prior to the Perth Motorplex. Despite starting early, it is when the Motorplex began that Brown really began coming into his own. Racing against some of the legends of the sport including Johnny Andersson, Bryan Mullings and Rod Bottrell, Matt was able to break through for his first podium finish on the 15th of February

2003, then grabbed his first Motorplex win at the very

> next show, the 8th of March, 2003. That would be his only win for the season, but the very next season he would rompy to victory on six occasions. Although he would take a break from Formula 500 action for a number of seasons, he would keep coming back, and even grabbed five feature wins in the 2011/12 season. His most recent win was on April 8, 2023, giving him a total of 26 career Motorplex wins, not to mention an incredible 65 podium finishes, and he has been a finalist on two occasions in the Perth Motorplex Driver of the Year Award. Still with plenty of laps left to run, one would think it is only a matter of time before he breaks back through

The sixteenth season of action was a big one, with four WA Titles, an Australian Title, a couple of rainouts and some huge results!

As per the last few seasons, 2015/16 got underway with a FAST racing show, held on the 10th of October with seven divisions hitting the track.

The official Grand Opening showdown was a week later, with Kyle Beard winning the first feature race of the season in the Wingless Sprints while Troy Johnson in the Formula 500's, Kaiden Manders in the Speedcars, Jamie Maiolo in the Sprintcars and Jamie Oldfield in the Late Models also drawing first blood in their respective divisions.

The second FAST show would take place a week later with eight divisions, while a fortnight after that would see the Magic Man 34 race held, doubling as the opening round of the Pro Speedcar Week. Neville Lance turned back the clocks and grabbed his first Magic Man race, defeating American Austin Brown and Lee Redmond. Also on the program Warren Oldfield won the Late model feature and Shaun Bradford the Sprintcars feature.

Next on the program was the King of Wings event, with just four divisions on the program. Brad Maiolo won his first Crown while Gavin Davis (Limited Sprintcars), David Hall (360 Sprintcars) and Troy Johnson (Formula 500's) also crowned Kings.

Ten feature races were held t the next FAST show, while at the Christmas Cup event on the 19th of December five divisions would strut their stuff. Adrian Haywood won the Formula 500's feature with Jason Kendrick (Sprintcars), Kodee Brown (super Sedans), Jamie Oldfield (Late Models) and Rob Watson Jnr (360 Sprintcars) also claiming wins.

A week later would be the traditional Boxing Day Bonanza event, David Priolo racing to victory in the Sprintcars feature while Matt Brown (Formula 500's), Kaiden Manders (Speedcars) and Warren Oldfield (Late Models) did the same.

With the New Year festivities out of the way, cars returned to the track for the Sprintcar Muster event. Tom Payet claimed the Wingless feature race, while Troy Johnson continued his good form to claim the Formula 500 feature, with Mick Doble (Limited Sprintcars), David Hall (360 Sprintcars) and David Priolo (Sprintcars) all did the same.

Next up was the Late Model National Title, held over two nights. On the opening night there were two preliminary feature races, with Michael Holmes and Queenslander Darren Kane each claiming one, while Steven Ellement (Formula 500's) and Chris Griffiths (Speedcars) also claiming wins.

The final night was an epic affair with Kodee Brown (below) racing his way to victory in the Australian Title final ahead of Ryan Halliday and Kye Blight. Steven Ellement (Formula 500's) and Bradley Maiolo (Sprintcars) also won feature races that night.



Unfortunately the 30th of January event, which was scheduled to host the WA 360 Sprintcar Title, was rained out, meaning the next event was the return once again of World Series Sprintcars.

On the 13th of February all the stars and their cars hit the track, with American Kyle Hirst outlasting the field, while Daniel Hartigan (Wingless Sprints) and Troy Johnson (Formula 500's) also claimed feature wins.

Two weeks later the travelling circus returned, this time for a double header Grand Finale. Daniel Harding broke through for the biggest win of his career when he won the preliminary night feature race, with Travis White (Speedcars) and Thomas Davies (Formula 500's) also claiming wins. The very next night Davies would repeat his efforts, While Kaiden Manders claimed the Speedcar win. In the end though, it was Steven Lines who grabbed the thirty lap Sprintcar feature ahead of Jamie Veal and Kyle Hirst

Ten divisions would contest a FAST show on the 11th of March, with the Westernapolis the very next night.

James McFadden would race his way to victory in that event, his very first Motorplex feature win, while on the same program Michael Keen would race his way to victory in the WA Limited Sprintcar Title. Neville Lance also won the Speedcar feature with Jamie Oldfield claiming the Late Models main event.

Another rainout would happen on the 26th of March, and then on the 9th of April, in what was the General Firecracker, WA Sprintcar Title meeting, we would only get one feature race in, that being the WA Title final with Victorian Tim Van Ginneken claiming the victory. This would mark the second time in the season that the WA 360 Title was rained out.

We finally got a show in on the 16th of April, a FAST Racing Series event, while the Silver Cup was able to run a week later with Troy Johnson (Formula 500's), Tom Payet (Wingless Sprints), Jamie veal (Sprintcars) and Warren Oldfield (Late Models all claiming wins.

The final event would be the Gold cup, with the WA 360 Title finally able to be run and won. Michael Keen claimed victory in that event and became the first driver to win more than one WA Title in a season at the Motorplex. Trent Pigdon (Sprintcars), Kaiden Manders (Speedcars) and Jacob Potts (Junior Sedans) also claimed feature wins, while Jamie Oldfield was successful in the final feature race of the season aboard his Late Model.

Just over one hundred feature races were shared by sixty four drivers over the season, with Troy Johnson the most successful with six, while Jamie Oldfield, Kaiden Manders and Todd Davey each claimed four. Four drivers claimed three wins, sixteen claimed two and forty drivers had one each.

Courtesy of his strong, consistent performances, Jamie Maiolo was also crowned the Perth Motorplex Driver of the Year.

SPEEDWAY GRIDS SCAN HERE!





This weekend will see the 28th annual Krikke Boys Shootout held right here at the Perth Motorplex, marking the third time the Motorplex has held it.

Back on Saturday the 8th of March, 1997, promising young talents Darryl and Jason Krikke were tragically killed in a road accident on their way home from testing their Sprintcar at the Claremont Speedway.

Aged just 21, Darryl was the son of two-time Australian Sprintcar Champion Ron Krikke and had been running well here in WA and was just starting to make a name for himself in appearances over East.

Jason, aged just 18, was the son of former WA Sprintcar Champion John Krikke, and was on a meteoric rise alongside his cousin as the one behind the scenes turning the spanners.

Just 25km from their home base of Bunbury, their car left the road and hit a tree, leaving the local Speedway devastated.

From the ultimate sadness was born the ultimate Sprintcar event: a true party where a Sprintcar race broke out scenarios, many teams making the trek across from the East to Bunbury every year, such is the prestige. Although a tribute was held at Claremont Speedway in the weeks after their death in conjunction with the King of Wings event, the first official Krikke Boys shootout was held in the 1997/98 season, won by the late great Michael Figliomeni.

In the years that followed Robbie Farr would amass a record seven wins in the event, while Victorian Max Dumesny, who was a close family friend and made the trip over every year, claimed the win three times. Figs would claim another event while others including Terry Cutts, the late American Jason Johnson, fellow countrymen Shane Stewart and Tim Kaeding, plus Kerry Madsen would all add their names to the winners list in the late 2000's and into the 2010's.

Brooke Tatnell finally won the race in the 2014/15 season while Steven Lines won the event the year after. In 2016/17 the race took on a new meaning when Shane Krikke, long time racer and team owner of Krikke Motorsport, passed away on June 26th, 2016 after a long battle with cancer.

James McFadden would win that year, the first of his three victories which would come in 2019 and 2020: Jamie Veal interrupting McFadden's streak when he claimed victory in 2018.

The race first headed to the Motorplex in 2021 (where Farr claimed his seventh win) before returning to Bunbury in 2022 where local driver Kris Coyle stunned the racing world to take the win, the first local driver in twenty years to achieve the feat.

The Krikke Boys Shootout then came back to the Motorplex the following year, where it has been held, with the blessing and support of Ron and John Krikke, ever since. Queenslander Lachlan McHugh won in 2023 while Tasmanian Jock Goodyer is the defending champion of this weekend's race having claimed victory last year.

Fifteen different drivers can claim having a Krikke Boys Shootout victory on their racing resume, but this weekend's field features only five former winners: McFadden, Madsen, Coyle, McHugh and Goodyer, all of whom want this win badly.

That being said, there is a pile of drivers who have podiumed in the race previously that would love to go even better: names like Callum Williamson, Andrew Priolo, Taylor Milling, Jason Kendrick, Cory Eliason and Daniel Harding all having previously finished in the top three and hungry to step onto the top step of that podium.

Add in a whole host of other drivers desperate to make their mark and it is certainly going to be an epic battle to see who is crowned 2025 Krikke Boys Shootout champion!

This weekend will mark the 28th annual WA Late Model Title being held at the Perth Motorplex, so it is high time to delve through the rich history of this event!

Winning Drivers

Thirteen drivers have claimed the win in the WA Title. Brad Blake leads the stats with an incredible ten wins, while Warren Oldfield, Craig Vosbergen, Jamie Oldfield, Brent Vosbergen and Kye Blight each have two wins and Chase Karpenko, Ryan Halliday, Marc Giancola, Paul Stubber, Alan Nylander, Scott McPherson and Kodee Brown have all scored one. Just two interstate drivers have claimed the win: Northern Territorian Chase Karpenko at the Motorplex in 05/06 and Scott McPherson at Northam in 07/08.

Podium Drivers

Over the years, thirty one drivers have made their way onto the WA Championship podium. Unsurprisingly, Blake leads the total podiums with fourteen. His ten wins have been joined by one second and three third places. Next best is Warren Oldfield with eight (two wins, four seconds, two thirds) and Ryan Halliday with six (a win, a second and four thirds).

Who is the driver on the podium most often without a win? Ben Ludlow (two seconds and two thirds) and John Cardy (a second and three thirds) share that dubious honour! No less than seven visiting drivers (Interstate and international) have featured on the podium over the years, three from New South Wales, two from the ACT, one from the Northern Territory and one American in Doug Drown!

The Tracks

In the early years, the Title was held as a series with rounds held at many tracks. This happened on four occasions, but if we look at the stand alone events, we can see the Motorplex has hosted the Title ten times, Bunbury and Collie three times, Manjimup and Northam twice and Geraldton, Kalgoorlie and Albany once.



Although research is still continuing into the WA Late Model Title (contact me if you have any info!), at this stage there has been one hundred and fourteen drivers who have contested at least one WA Late Model Title event. That number will grow tonight with ten drivers nominated in tonight's field for their first ever WA Late Model Title.

So who has done the most WA Late Model titles?? Well, Brad Blake has an incredible record, having been at all but one of the Titles held: twenty six so far after missing the 2020/21 version. Next best is Jay Cardy with nineteen, Craig Vosbergen and Warren Oldfield with eighteen, Ryan Halliday with sixteen and Matt Goodlad with fifteen. Remember, some of these numbers may increase slightly when the research is complete!

As is quite clear, the winningest number in the WA Title is the #0 as driven by Brad Blake. The #0 has been on the podium fourteen times, while the next best numbers are #99 and #15 with seven appearances each, while #8 appears 5 times. The #3 is the only single digit number to have never appeared inside the top three finishers. What may also be interesting is that two drivers have contested the Title running under six different car numbers each. Brad Ludlow has raced in Title events as A1, #2, #10, #21, #92 and #95, while Jason Oldfield has raced under #9, #11, #15J, #55, #61 and #96!

This is the tenth time the Motorplex has held the WA Late Model Title and the sixth time it has hosted the WA Formula 500 Title (stand alone events only). It has become a bit of a thing over the years for Double Titles to be held (on the same night: this weekend is the seventeenth time we have held more than one Title on any given night!

The Krikke Boys Shootout is far more than just a race.

Now in its 28th year, this event has provided many exciting and memorable moments over the years, as well as some brilliant racing, firstly for many years at the Krikke family's home track of Bunbury Speedway and, in more recent times, here at the Perth Motorplex.

However, it is important to remember why this event exists in the first place.

This event originally came to be after the tragic passing of Darryl and Jason Krikke in a road crash whilst they were on their home to Bunbury from a meeting at Claremont Speedway in 1997.

It was a devastating tragedy that shook the West Australian Speedway community to its very core.

Darryl, 21, the son of two-time National Sprintcar Champion Ron Krikke, was a promising young racer in his own right and someone many people within the sport saw as a possible future champion of the sport.

Jason, 18, the son of John Krikke (a two-time WA state Sprintcar champion in his own right), was far more interested in the sport's mechanical and technical aspects. He aspired to be one of the nation's leading Sprintcar crew chiefs, a goal he was well on his way to achieving.

The Krikke Boys Shootout also honours the memory of Darryl and Jason's cousin Shane and Darryl's brother Michael, (who we lost to illness several years ago).

Shane Krikke was a handy racer in his own right, but after a battle with non-Hodgkins Lymphoma forced a premature end to his racing career in 1998, he truly found his calling in the speedway world as the charismatic leader of the Krikke Motorsports team.

Under his leadership, Krikke Motorsport and the iconic W2 hotrod became a powerhouse of Australian Sprintcar racing and widely recognised as one of the most professional Sprintcar teams in the world.

After a long and courageous battle with the disease, cancer would eventually take Shane's life. He passed away in 2016 at the age of 46.

Naturally, there will always be an element of sadness to this event.

The Shootout honours the memories and lives of four men whose lives ended far too soon, and nothing will ever take anything away from that fact.

However, The Krikke Boys Shootout is a celebration in many ways.

In addition to the memories of those four men, the Shootout also celebrates the enduring legacy of one of West Australian Speedway's most beloved, accomplished, and respected families.

It is hard to measure just how massive of an impact that Krikke Motorsport and the Krikke family have had on our sport over the past 46 years.

For much of that time, they have been at the pinnacle of the sport and have set a benchmark for all others to follow.

Over the years as a team, Krikke Motorsport has won 12 State Championships, 7 National Championships, and 5 World Series Sprintcars Titles (plus many other major victories along the journey).

They've had some of the sport's best drivers help them along the way.

Donny Schatz, Skip Jackson, Robbie Farr, Mark Wells, Kerry Madsen, Kyle Hirst, Brooke Tatnell. They have all piloted the W2 hotrod in the past.

Now with Dayne Kingshott behind the wheel and Ryan Krikke (Shane's brother) at the helm of the team, the KMS crew are entering another golden era of success.

Dayne is someone that I think is more than capable of winning of an Australian Sprintcar Championship in the future.

He has won 5 WA Speedcar Championships, an Australian Speedcar Championship, a WA Sprintcar Championship and is the reigning Maddington Toyota Series Champion.

For all the success the "Great Dayne" has had, this is one event that he is yet to win.

Being a Bunbury lad who grew up around the Krikke's and the KMS workshop, you know he'd love nothing more than to deliver the Krikke family their 4th Shootout victory.

Some races are for money, trophies and prestige

But this event has a far deeper meaning than any of those material things.

The Krikke Boys Shootout is about honour, legacy, family and respect.

Ask any driver in the pits how much the Krikke Boys Shootout means to win and they will tell you.

There's a reason why so many travel from far and wide year after year to be here for this event.

Its more than just a race.

This is for the boys.



The Top

In 2012 Tom Payet burst onto the racing scene, grabbing his first Wingless Sprint podium, and from that moment on, he has simply not looked back. 'Buddah' as he is affectionately known quickly made an impact and after a pile of podium finishes he would finally **Speedcars**, Wingless break through for his first feature race win on the 27th of March 2015. This would be the first of eight Wingless feature

races over three seasons, including the 2016/17 WA Wingless Sprint Title.

Tom would then make his way into the Speedcar division, teaming up with multiple car owners over the years, and grabbing his first Speedcar feature win on the 4th of November 2004. He then settled with Bennett Motorsports and since being in Speedcars he has won two WA Titles here at the Motorplex and plenty of other blue ribbon events: 23 Speedcar feature wins at the Motorplex and counting, including the 2020/21 season when he grabbed an incredible eight wins. Last season he was a hot favourite to win the Australian Speedcar Title here but heartbreakingly he finished on the infield, his reaction to his own misfortune, then the support he showed for other competitors despite his own feelings certainly made him even more popular. He currently sits at 31 feature race wins at the venue and a total of 68 podium finishes. Tom has been nominated as the Perth Motorplex Driver of the Year four times, has three Speedcar Track Championships (in the last four years!) and enamoured himself to legions of fans with his laid back attitude, hard nosed racing style and

infectious sense of humour, not to mention his love of Strawberry milk! This list is not definitive, podiums, level competition (field sizes), longevity, driver engagement and popularity and number of divisions competed in with success.

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
